

# FIRE SAFETY ESCAPE PLAN

The Fire Safety Plan is required to have a graphic version of the plan, as well as other common areas of the home, to the outside with a designated meeting place. There must also be a written plan that explains the exit routes and who is responsible to assist the person in exiting the home, contact 911, etc.

The person should know how to safely exit the home in case of an emergency as independently as possible, with regular practice of the exit plan. The written and graphic plan must both be posted in the home.

If a new individual moves into the home, the Fire Safety Plan needs to be updated and posted in the home.
