# **DAIL Shared Living: Home Safety Inspection**Helpful Tips

# Helpful tools to have for the pre-inspection:

- GFCI tester with button to trip
- Tape measure
- Wood/Pellet Stove manuals
- Copies of Fire Safety Escape Plan (written instructions and map), water test (if required), chimney inspection and cleaning report (if required)

# **Quick Tips:**

## • Fire Extinguisher

- Must be mounted in clear sight;
- Hung not more than 5 feet above the floor. (NFPA 10-2010, section 6.1.3.8.1, in part);
- Hang between heat source and door to outside (not a breezeway or garage entrance);
- <u>Cannot</u> be hung in a closet or pantry.

#### Window

- Measurement is the window opening only Open the window entirely to measure only the open space.
- Egress Windows in Bedroom must open to at least 24" high and at least 20" wide Must have at least 5.0 (old) –1994 or older; or 5.7 (new) square foot area
- Windows must be <u>LESS</u> than 44" from the floor.
- o 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> floor windows must be <u>at least</u> 24" off the floor, or safety guard is needed.
- Windows cannot be blocked by gadgets, beds, Air Conditioning Units, etc.
- Basement window Egress, drain system and potentially a window well will be required. Individual recommendations for basement egress will be provided by Evergreen on a case-by-case basis.

# Egress route

- Egress route must be clear of items (furniture, belonging, fixtures) on the inside
  of the home and clear of snow, ice, and items from the exterior of the house.
- A 2<sup>nd</sup> floor entrance needs a roof covering if it is the main entrance to the home or unit, and it is on the exterior of the building. It must be a cleared egress route (no ice & snow).

#### Electric

- GCFI required for any receptacles 6' from any water source (sinks, hot tubs, aquariums, washing machines, hot water tanks, etc.)
- No extension cords through the walls ever!

## Bedroom Door

- Solid Surface door is required on a bedroom; if there is glass in the door, it must be Tempered glass with identifying label.
- Any doors with glass should have a curtain, covering, or frosted glass for privacy.
   Contact DAIL Quality Management with any questions.
- Plexiglass is only acceptable if the material can be proven to be heat resistant (there must be manufactures documentation)
- Garage within 30' of house (attached or detached) will need to be inspected.

# Railings

- Bulkheads and basements with stairs, need appropriate railings.
- A 2 x 4 board is not a handrail.
- At least one handrail IF the stairs are over 4 risers.
- Guards / railings around porches –
   Deck less than 24" off the ground- no railing is needed
   Deck between 24" to 30" off the ground a 30" railing or higher
   Deck greater than 30" off the ground a 42" railing or higher



### Wood/Pellet Stoves and Electric Heaters

- o If the pipe can be moved easily by hand, it is not safe;
- Electric heaters need a 6" clearance (including curtains, furniture, personal items);
- Receptacles for electric heaters cannot be over the electric heater;
- Mantel Height is dependent on how far it sticks out past the firebox. (See chart below)

## General Minimum Requirements (unless Manual provides different measurements)

- Clearances to combustibles 36"/18"
- Stovepipe clearance 18"/9" from center of pipe
- Hearth depth 18"
- Proof of chimney cleaning and inspection by a professional
